People with MND have the right to an early diagnosis and information 2. People with MND have the right to access quality care and treatments 3. People with MND have the right to be treated as individuals and with dignity and respect 4. People with MND have the right to maximise their quality of life 5. Carers of people with MND have the right to be valued, respected, listened to and well supported Adoption of the Charter will promote awareness and understanding of Motor Neurone Disease amongst elected Members and staff across the Council. This will help to ensure that people with MND and their carers and families receive appropriate support from the Council where it is within powers to do so or assist with relevant community support in order to make a positive difference to their lives.
