Deliberate ignition of material on the green open space to the side of No. 35 Mercia Close, associated with the ASB and gathering of youth elements in the area. This caused extensive damage to trees in the area and subsequently these had to be removed by our Street Scene Tree Officer Esther due to H&S reasons from the fire. In addition this could have if not sopped in time spread rapidly to the acoustic fencing that forms part of the boundary line for the west coast mainline tracks and would have potentially cost in excess of £500,000 if Network Raid had to stop the lines from operating.
