26. When it's not a complaint There are times when we cannot investigate a complaint, this is usually because there are other separate independent appeal processes or procedures that should be followed.
In our new policy, we're making it clearer on when something isn't a complaint that we can't investigate as part of our policy, please tell us if you agree with our list.
What isn't a complaint that we can investigate?  Complains about something that happened over six months ago, A request for something, for example reporting an issue with litter, fly-tipping, graffiti. These are counted as requests for work and not a failure, Request for support from environmental health, such as with a noisy neighbour, dirty restaurants, Reporting a social housing repair, or when the target date hasn't been reached, Issues about licenses, permits, approvals, consents, permissions or registrations or any related enforcement actions (these are dealt with under other procedures), Complaints that are following a judicial process or legal process (such as a planning decision), An appeal against a Planning application, a Housing application, a Benefit award decision, a parking ticket or statutory notices (these are dealt with under other procedures) Complaints about staffing appointments, dismissals, pay, conduct and other Human Resource policy and procedures, Complaints made by members of staff against other members of staff that are covered under other policies, Complaints against members/councilors conduct (these are covered under a separate code of conduct). Anything where legal proceedings have been started.
