

Application to Vary a Premises Licence to specify an individual as

Designated Premises Supervisor

Reminisce, 79-80 Bolebridge Street, Tamworth, Staffordshire B79

Staffordshire Police are making representations to this variation and I set out below details of the grounds upon which the police are objecting.

The application seeks to install Neil John HATHERALL, born as Designated Premises Supervisor. HATHERALL has an unspent relevant conviction. The matter was heard at South East Staffordshire Magistrates Court on 26th August 2011 where he was convicted on nine separate counts of allowing a licensable activity to be carried out on/from the premises other than in accordance with authorisation, Licensing Act 2003, Section 136(1)(b). He was given a £560.00 fine and was ordered to pay costs of £85.00 and victim surcharge of £15.00. A conviction under Section 136 is considered a relevant conviction under the Licensing Act 2003 and under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 the relevant period for a fine in this case is 5 years as HATHERALL was over 18 years old at the time the offence was committed.

Staffordshire Police are of the view that the granting of this application would undermine the licensing objective the prevention of crime and disorder.
