Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

1 Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol (Section 19)

- (1) Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions:
- (2) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (4) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (5) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (6) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- (7) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (8) (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- (9) The responsible person shall ensure that-

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

2 Mandatory condition: exhibition of films (Section 20)

- (1) Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- (2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
- (3) Where-
 - (a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - (b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,
 - admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.
- (4) In this section-
 - "children" means persons aged under 18; and
 - "film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

3 Mandatory condition: door supervision (Section 21)

- (1) Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must be
 - (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
 - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of Section 4 of that Act.
- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed-
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to-
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section- (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3 (2) of that Act) (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Annex 2 - Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

1 All licensable activities must take place indoors.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 2 Condition deleted on 14 September 2012 (Minor variation)
- 3 SIA registered door supervisors must be employed at the premises at a minimum ratio of 1:75 from 21:00 hours on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays until the end of trading when members of the public have vacated the premises and when the premises are closed and the doors are locked.
- 4 Any door supervisors used at the premises must wear high visibility clothing whilst on duty at the premises.
- Any door supervisors used at the premises must be in possession of and display their Security Industry Authority (SIA) badge at all times whilst on duty at the premises.
- A register must be kept of all door supervisors used at the premises. The register must be fully completed and signed by the door supervisor or person in charge of the premises prior to any door supervisor commencing duty and upon completion of any duty.
- The register of door supervisors referred to in condition 6 above must contain the following information:
 - (a) The full name of the door supervisor on duty;
 - (b) The SIA badge number of the door supervisor;
 - (c) The name of the company providing the door supervisor;
 - (d) A contact name for the company providing the door supervisor; and
 - (e) The telephone number for the company providing the door supervisor.
- The licensee shall liaise with the Police authority to promote the prevention of crime and disorder on the premises.
- 9 A CCTV system must be installed and be in operation at the premises. The installed CCTV system shall be approved by the Police Licensing Officer (PLO).
- 10 The CCTV monitor and control unit must be positioned in a secure part of the licensed premises.
- 11 The Police shall be allowed access to the CCTV system immediately upon request by the Police.
- 12 A person who is trained and competent in the use of and operation of the CCTV system shall:
 - (a) be in attendance at the premises at all times licensable activities are taking place; and
 - (b) shall be able to fully operate the CCTV system; and
 - (c) shall be able to download any information requested by the Police in a recognised format.
- The CCTV clock must be set correctly and maintained (taking into account Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) and British Summer Time (BST).
- A facility must be available to remove from the CCTV system a copy of any material relevant to any ongoing Police investigation.
- 15 Clear signage must be displayed at all entrances and exits, including fire exits, indicating that CCTV is in operation.
- All CCTV images must be retained for a period of not less than 31 days.
- An incident register of all occurrences and ejections from the premises must be maintained on site at the premises. Any details of public order or misuse of drugs offences must be recorded in the register. The register must be produced and made available for inspection upon the request of a responsible authority.

- All employees involved in the sale of alcohol who are not the holders of a Personal Licence to sell alcohol must receive training on the law and procedures relating to the sale of alcohol when they commence employment at the premises. All employees involved in the sale of alcohol who are not the holders of a Personal Licence to sell alcohol must also receive refresher training on the law and procedures relating to the sale of alcohol at 6 monthly intervals. This training must be provided by the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- The training referred to in condition 18 above must be recorded. These training records must be produced and made available for inspection upon request by a responsible authority.
- An electronic till must be in operation at the premises. The till clock must be set correctly and maintained taking into account Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) and British Summer Time (BST).
- 21 All till receipts must show the time and date of the sale.
- When the Designated Premises Supervisor is not on duty at the premises a nominated person must be present on the premises and be in charge of the premises. The nominated person must be authorised in writing by the Designated Premises Supervisor.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

23 Condition deleted on 14 September 2012 (Minor Variation)

The Protection of Children from Harm

- Access to the premises by children is prohibited.
- A challenge 25 policy must be in operation at the premises. If any person who is attempting to buy alcohol appears to those engaged in selling or supplying alcohol to be under the age of 25, those engaged in selling or supplying alcohol must ensure sight of evidence that they are at least 18 years before any sale of alcohol is made.
- The only acceptable forms of identification permitted to verify proof of age shall be:
 - (a) a current and valid passport;
 - (b) a current and valid photo ID driving licence; or
 - (c) a current and valid proof of age scheme card with the PASS approved hologram.
- 27 Signage indicating that a Challenge 25 policy is in operation shall be displayed at all entrances and exits to the premises and at all till points.
- A refusal of sales register or electronic means of recording refusals of alcohol sales must be held at the premises. The register must be completed each and every time any person is refused the sale of alcohol.


